To implement Parent Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT) to build positive parenting skills for caregivers of children involved in child welfare services and reduce the rates of ADHD and ODD.

To develop the first Behavioral Health Urgent Care Clinic in Southeast Michigan for those experiencing non-emergent behavioral health concerns.
